<u>Explanation</u>: The FY 1999 Emergency Supplemental, P.L. 105-277, provided funds for emergency repairs resulting from damages in Korea caused by the monsoon storms of August 1998. Section 103 of the Supplemental contains language that permits the transfer of up to \$29,454,000 from Operation and Maintenance, Army, FY 1999, to Military Construction, Army, FY 1999, for these emergency repairs. The current reprogramming requirement is for \$8.0 million. This action will realign funds for proper execution.
