This action is for the immediate replacement of 90 Conventional Air Launched Cruise Missiles consumed during Operation DESERT FOX in December 1998 and two needed for testing. Funds will be used to modify and convert 92 Air Launched Cruise Missiles to Conventional Air Launched Cruise Missiles under Block 1A modification. Modification includes improved blast/fragment warhead, improved accuracy, third generation global positioning system, precision strike accuracy, anti-jam, and improved Warhead Interface Unit.

Because the Titan program is incrementally funded, funds are temporarily available in FY 1999 with no short-term program impacts. However, the Air Force will seek to restore these funds. The funds must be restored to Titan to maintain current Milstar, DSP, DMSP satellite launch schedules and costs, and avoid programmatic changes that could lead to a permanent critical skill loss.
