This internal reprogramming action transfers funds between Operation and Maintenance, Navy (O&M,N), FY 2000, and Research, Development, Test, and Evaluation, Navy (RDT&E,N), 00/01, for Sea Smart and Delta-One training initiatives and the Joint Experimentation Program. This action uses \$.9 million of general transfer authority, pursuant to section 8005 of Public Law 106-79, the DoD Appropriations Act, FY 2000, and section 1001 of Public Law 106-65, the National Defense Authorization Act for FY 2000. This realignment does not change the purpose for which the funds were originally appropriated, meets all administrative and legal requirements of the Congress and has not previously been denied by the Congress.

Explanation: The United States Atlantic Command was designated Executive Agent for Joint Experimentation effective October 1, 1998. Funding was included in the FY 2000 President's Budget for both RDT&E and O&M,N-funded positions. However, 7 civilian positions and associated funding that were requested and appropriated in Operation and Maintenance, Navy, should be transferred to RDT&E,N, 00/01, because the funds support the research and development activities within the Joint Experimentation Program. This transfer leaves \$.6 million and 13 workyears in the United States Joint Forces Command Headquarters O&M,N account to pay for support personnel salaries and equipment and supplies. The amounts being transferred are available for reprogramming without impact to the approved O&M,N program.
