Explanation: The Aviation Combined Arms Tactical Trainer – Aviation Reconfigurable Manned Simulator (AVCATT-A) is a FY 1999 Force XXI – WRAP initiative. It provides a system for collective training, mission rehearsal and joint experimentation. It is a modular suite of six reconfigurable aviation warfighting cockpits that will replicate all current attack, cargo, observation, reconnaissance-attack and utility helicopters. They are to be networked to the Army Tactical Command and Control System (ATCCS) workstations and are to be driven by software that creates the virtual battlefield.

The FY 1999 WRAP funds initiated the software effort to create an aviation specific virtual battlefield. This action will provide the FY 2000 funding to complete this effort.
