<p><u>Explanation:</u> The procurement of the Interim Armored Vehicle (IAV), previously known as the Medium Armored Vehicle Family, is part of the Army's transition to a more deployable, lethal, and responsive force. The Army intends to stand up six brigades of IAVs between FY 2001 and FY 2007 to support the initiative. All four committees have approved the IAV in their FY 2001 committee reports. Additional procurements, beyond the six brigades, is dependent upon a decision in FY 2003 on whether or not it is technically feasible to initiate the development and procurement of the Future Combat System (FCS). The acquisition plan for this system is to have full and open competition with an award date currently scheduled for September 14, 2000. The FY 2000 WTCV funding is required to fund long lead items, contractor non-recurring and start-up costs, funded quantities to support the FY 2001 procurement, and/or initiation of Low-Rate Initial Production for test vehicles.</p>
