<u>Explanation</u>: Contract savings from the Tomahawk program will be used to finance the procurement of an additional 48 SLAM-ER missiles. The additional quantity is needed to increase the inventory of standoff precision guided munitions.

<u>Explanation</u>: Public Law 106-31, the 1999 Emergency Supplemental Appropriations Act, provided \$431.1 million to remanufacture 624 older Tomahawk missiles into the more capable Block III configuration. Recently concluded negotiations with the prime contractor, Raytheon Missile Systems, indicate that the remanufacture of the 624 missiles can be accomplished with \$406.8 million, a savings of \$24.3 million.
