This action is submitted for prior approval because it involves a congressional special interest item and uses general transfer authority, pursuant to section 8005 of Public Law 106-79, the DoD Appropriations Act, 2000; and section 1001 of Public Law 106-65, the National Defense Authorization Act for FY 2000. It reprograms funding in support of a higher priority item, based on unforeseen military requirements, than that for which the funds were originally appropriated. 

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Explanation: Funds are required to procure 20 Low Rate Initial Production systems to support Initial Operational, Test, and Evaluation (IOT&E) of the Life Support for Trauma and Transport (LSTAT) program. Additionally, there is a requirement for clinical evaluations, technical testing and program product improvements for litter carrier system weight reduction. The \$1.0 million follow-on effort is funded in FY 2001.

Budget Activity 3: Other Support Equipment

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Explanation: This is a congressional special interest item. In FY 2000, the Congress provided \$11.0 million for the Life Support for Trauma and Transport (LSTAT) program. Of that amount, \$8.0 million was provided to procure the Advanced Surgical Suite for Trauma Care (ASSTC) program for Army National Guard (ARNG) emergency support. However, these funds cannot be used to procure the ASSTC because the ASSTC never reached a Milestone II Decision at the Army Medical Command. The remaining amount, \$3.0 million, was provided to support the procurement of LSTAT units. However, before those systems can be procured, IOT&E must first be conducted on the LSTAT.

These funds are therefore available for reprogramming into Research, Development, Test, and Evaluation, to conduct the required LSTAT testing.
