
To support the IED Defeat mission, this reprogramming action transfers \$219.7 million from within the \$469.7 million available from the Iraq Freedom Fund (IFF), 06/07, appropriation to the Operation and Maintenance, Army, 06/06, appropriation; Other Procurement, Army, 06/08, appropriation; and the Research, Development, Test, and Evaluation, Army, 06/07, appropriation. This supports urgent, real-time warfighting needs. This transfer is in accordance with provisions in Public Law 108-287 and Public Law 109-77.

Explanation: Funds will be used to procure and field new, promising solutions to predict, prevent, detect, neutralize, and mitigate improvised explosive devices (IEDs). These solutions will include a wide range of equipment to address an evolving, and ever-changing threat. The equipment will include electronic countermeasures equipment, radars, x-ray equipment, explosive ordnance disposal equipment, robots, surveillance equipment, physical security equipment, armored vehicles, and body and vehicle armor. Equipment procurement will benefit all deployed forces in theater, regardless of which service may ultimately retain the equipment in inventory.
