To support the Improvised Explosive Device (IED) Defeat mission and urgent real-time warfighting needs, this reprogramming action transfers \$690.0 million from the Research, Development, Test, and Evaluation, Army, 06/07; Aircraft Procurement, Navy, 06/08; Procurement, Marine Cops, 06/08; Aircraft Procurement, Air Force, 06/08; and Other Procurement, Air Force, 06/08, appropriations, to the Operation and Maintenance, Army, 06/06; Other Procurement, Army, 06/08; and Research, Development, Test, and Evaluation, Army, 06/07, appropriations. This transfer uses general transfer authority pursuant to section 8005 of Public Law 109-148, the Department of Defense (DoD) Appropriations Act, 2006; and section 1001 of Public Law 109-163, the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2006. These actions reprogram funding in support of higher priority items, based on unforeseen military requirements, than those for which the funds were originally appropriated; and is determined to be necessary in the national interest. It meets all administrative and legal requirements and the items have not previously been denied by the Congress. The Department plans to restore the funding for the programs being used to finance the critical IED defeat mission from funds appropriated in the FY 2006 Emergency Supplemental appropriations.
