This reprogramming action is submitted for prior approval because it exceeds thresholds and includes a new start.

**Part I:** Realigns \$89.550 million of FY 2007 funding for the following:

- \$72.000 million within the Research, Development, Test, and Evaluation, Air Force, 07/08, appropriation for the Space Based Space Surveillance (SBSS) program (\$35.0 million), and a classified program, new start (\$37.0 million).
- \$17.550 million within the Research, Development, Test, and Evaluation, Defense-Wide, 07/08 appropriation for the development of a Sea-based Terminal ballistic missile defense.

<u>Part II</u>: Realigns within the Missile Procurement, Air Force, 06/08, appropriation \$13.276 million of excess FY 2006 funding for the Evolved Expendable Launch Vehicle (EELV) space program to the missile spares and Defense Meteorological Satellite Program.

This action reprograms funding in support of higher priority items, based on unforeseen military requirements, than those for which originally appropriated; and is determined to be necessary in the national interest. It meets all administrative and legal requirements and none of the items has previously been denied by the Congress.

Explanation: Funds are required to finance cost growth in the Space Based Space Surveillance (SBSS) Block 10 program. This program replaces the aging Space-Based Visible sensor on the orbiting Midcourse Space Experiment spacecraft and significantly improves the accuracy and timeliness of our awareness of space object/threat locations. Additional funding is needed to maintain schedule toward an FY 2009 launch and to maintain critical labor skills through FY 2007. If not approved, the program must reduce contractor personnel by 40 percent in FY 2007, resulting in a severe disruption in the cost (\$60-80 million increase) and schedule (18-month delay) for construction and integration of the spacecraft.
