This reprogramming action is submitted in two parts. This reprogramming action transfers funding in support of higher priority items than those for which funds were originally appropriated, meets all administrative and legal requirements, and is determined to be necessary in the national interest. Congressional special interest programs will not be affected by these adjustments. None of the items in this reprogramming action has been previously denied by the Congress.

**Part I** transfers \$70.0 million from the Operation and Maintenance, Army, 07/07, appropriation (\$35.0 million) and Operation and Maintenance, Navy, 07/07, appropriation (\$35.0 million) to the Operation and Maintenance, Defense-Wide, 07/07, appropriation to finance global train and equip (T&E) projects. This transfer is pursuant to section 1206 of Public Law 109-163, the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year (FY) 2006, as amended. This reprogramming action uses \$70 million of special transfer authority pursuant to section 1302 of Public Law 110-28, the United States Troop Readiness, Veterans' Care, Katrina Recovery, and Iraq Accountability Appropriations Act, 2007.

**Part II** transfers \$35.0 million from the Aircraft Procurement, Air Force, 07/09, and Research, Development, Test and Evaluation, Air Force, 07/08 appropriations to the Operation and Maintenance, Defense-Wide, 07/07, appropriation to finance global T&E projects. This reprogramming action uses \$35.0 million of general transfer authority pursuant to section 8005 of Public Law 109-289, the Department of Defense Appropriations Act, 2007; and section 1001 of Public Law 109-364, the John Warner National Defense Authorization Act for FY 2007.
