This reprogramming action transfers \$873.847 million from the Mine Resistant Ambush Protected (MRAP) Transfer Fund, 11/12, appropriation to various Defense appropriations for execution in FY 2011. This is pursuant to the authority provided in Title IX of Division A of Public Law 112-10, the Department of Defense (DoD) Appropriations Act, 2011. The MRAP Vehicle program is a critical priority joint-Service program which supports urgent warfighter needs for the protection of operating forces in Iraq and Afghanistan.

Detailed test plans will be developed with sufficient details relative to ULV technology, to accurately assess ULV Research Prototype specific system capabilities. Lessons learned will help shape and inform the MRAP vehicle program and other vehicle programs.</p>
