<u>Description</u>: The additional \$3.287 million is required to award the standard design urban assault course. Primary facilities include an urban assault course, range operations and control area, range operations and storage building, and an ammunition breakdown building.

<u>Justification</u>: This project underwent an abbreviated parametric design process prior to the budget submission that did not consider the rocky terrain at the United States Military Academy project site. In order to find suitably flat areas, the five training stations associated with the urban assault course are sited at a greater distance from each other than is typical for an urban assault course. The project was solicited as a competitive Lowest Price Technically Acceptable Total Small Business Set-Aside. Final proposals were received on September 22, 2011. All proposals significantly exceeded the program amount. The requested reprogramming will provide the funds necessary to award 95 percent of approved project scope. Based on current operational requirements, a latrine (5 percent of approved project scope) is no longer required. A Title 10, Section 2853 cost increase notification was sent to the congressional committees on or around November 17, 2011.
