Explanation: Funds are required to continue and expand on efforts to mitigate the effects of Digital Radio Frequency Memory (DRFM) based Countermeasures. These efforts include: analysis via simulations and refined algorithms in order to address the evolving threat. The DRFM is a subset of the larger Electronic Attack (EA) threat that will be faced by several Army Air Defense systems. The DRFM EA systems are both emerging and sophisticated. The funding requested will support Electronic Attack Protection (EAP) studies, analyses, and simulations that will accelerate the fielding of new capability in Patriot, Sentinel, and Integrated Air and Missile Defense (IAMD). The previous submission, FY 12-05 PA, was denied by the Senate Armed Services Committee (SASC) because it was a <u>new start</u> initiative; however, the Conference Report accompanying the Fiscal Year 2013 National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) states that the conferees agreed to authorize an additional \$38.0 million for a new DRFM program. This is a <u>new start</u>. Total cost of this effort is \$71.3 million (\$22.2 million in FY 2012, \$15.1 million in FY 2013, \$21.0 million in FY 2014, and \$13.0 million in FY 2015). This is a base budget requirement.
