This reprogramming action is submitted for prior approval to comply with section 149(f) of Public Law 113-164, Continuing Appropriations Resolution, 2015. This action realigns \$225.0 million of resources within various Operation and Maintenance appropriations to support U. S. efforts to provide assistance to appropriately vetted elements of the Syrian opposition and other appropriately vetted Syrian groups and individuals. This reprogramming action provides funding in support of a higher priority item, based on unforeseen military requirements, than those for which originally appropriated; is determined to be necessary in the national interest; and must be undertaken immediately in the interest of national security. It meets all administrative and legal requirements, and none of the items have previously been denied by the Congress.

This reprogramming provides for the support for the first classes of 300 each at two sites with an operational training start target date during the second quarter of FY 2015. The funds will be used for infrastructure and facilities work, leasing cost, construction of firing ranges, force protection, training and support, stipends, transportation, base operations, and life support. A portion of the funds will be use for the acquisition of long lead time supplies, equipment, arms, ammunition, and other support items for the total annualized target of 5,400 trainees.

The funds will also provide for the U.S. trainer and enabler costs. This is a **new start**. This is an Overseas Contingency Operations requirement.
