This reprogramming action is submitted for approval because these actions use special transfer authority. This reprogramming action provides funding in support of higher priority items, based on unforeseen military requirements, than those for which funds were originally appropriated; and are determined to be necessary in the national interest. They meet all administrative and legal requirements, and none of the items has previously been denied by the Congress.

Part I of this reprogramming action transfers \$63.866 million from the Drug Interdiction and Counter-Drug Activities, Defense, 15/15, appropriation to the Operation and Maintenance, Defense-Wide, 15/15, appropriation. This reprogramming action uses \$63.866 million of special transfer authority pursuant to section 9002 of Title IX Overseas Contingency Operations (OCO) of division C of Public Law 113-235, the Department of Defense (DoD) Appropriations Act, 2015.

Part II of this reprogramming action transfers \$63.866 million from the Operation and Maintenance, Defense-Wide, 15/15, appropriation to the Global Security Contingency Fund, 12/17, appropriation. This reprogramming uses \$63.866 million of special transfer authority pursuant to section 8071 of division C of Public Law 113-235, the DoD Appropriations Act, 2015 and is in accordance with section 1207, as amended, of Public Law 112-81, the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year (FY) 2012.

Explanation: Funds are available due to several requirements for the Afghanistan Special Mission Wing (SMW) being funded from the Afghanistan Security Forces Fund instead of Drug Interdiction and Counterdrug Activities, Defense. The SMW executes both counterterrorism (CT) and counternarcotics (CN) missions. This year the SMW is executing more CT missions than originally assumed for FY 2015, making ASFF the more appropriate source of funding for the majority of SMW sustainment. Thus, these funds are excess to current CN requirements for the Afghanistan SMW. This is Title IX OCO budget funding.

Explanation: Funds are required to support the U.S. African Peacekeeping Rapid Response Partnership (APRRP) initiative as part of the U.S. effort to counter terrorism and to build the capacity of partnership nations to assist in this fight. Specifically, this initiative will provide assistance to the Governments of Rwanda, Tanzania, and Uganda so that they can build, strengthen, and institutionalize the capability of their security forces to plan for, deploy, and sustain rapid response peacekeeping forces in support of African Union and UN-mandated operations. These activities, while broad in scope and function, focus on preparing each nation to respond to destabilizing events, including acts of terrorism, and provide regional support. The U.S. assistance will focus on providing technical expertise, training, equipment, and small-scale military construction. Details addressing specific support are in the notification letter provided by the Deputy Secretary of Defense to the Chairmen of the appropriate congressional oversight committees. This is an OCO budget requirement
