The DoD will provide scalable, tailored training adapted to fit the threat and operational environment. The DoD will continue to provide specialized enabler and leadership training to those individuals with demonstrated aptitude, capability, and commitment to the campaign. Success in these efforts will allow vetted Syrian opposition groups to defend and secure territory, initiate offensive military actions in support of the broader campaign to defeat ISIL, and promote conditions for a negotiated settlement to end the conflict in Syria.
