<u>Description:</u> The project constructs additional road surface by widening the travel lanes of Cooper Avenue from Rockenbach Road to Mapes Road and adding two lanes. Similarly widening Reece Road from Cooper Avenue to the point east of Rose Street to adjoin the new four lane road from the Access Control Point at the Reece gate and adding two lanes to Rose Street.

<u>Justification</u>: An additional \$22.5 million is required to award Options 1-3 of the project. The cost growth can be attributed to additional work and schedule delay required to address multiple utility obstructions and relocations discovered during design, additional effort to execute complex construction phasing that was not initially anticipated with special work periods to accommodate an adjacent road project and maintain traffic flow, and significant price escalation in the local construction industry during the extended project schedule.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup> A 10 U.S.C. 2853 notification dated September 25, 2023 was submitted to the congressional committees, reflecting a current work estimate of \$42.9 million.

<u>Project Description</u>: Construct two high-bay rooms, an addition for full motion Combat Rescue Helicopter simulators with roll-up door and 2.5-ton crane for each bay. The addition includes space for the following functions: restrooms, mechanical/electrical, image generator, avionics desktop trainer, offices, classified and unclassified areas, multi-purpose space to accommodate meeting, educational, and briefing functions, and other training apparatus.

<u>Justification</u>: The cost increase is due higher costs for labor, materials, insurance, equipment, fuel prices, and the impact that supply chain delays have on project scheduling. Additionally, local construction market prices have increased based on material and labor supply costs.

A 10 U.S.C. §2853 cost variation notification dated July 19, 2023, was submitted to the congressional committees.

The Air Force submitted a 10 U.S.C. §2853 notification in August 2021 to increase the authorization to \$154.6 million. Although additional appropriations were enacted for this project in FY 2023 (\$91.0 million), the project was awarded for \$150.9 million.
