

TELEPHONE (CLASS B UNOFFICIAL SERVICE)
FISCAL YEAR 1998

Telephone services provided by a Military Department or a Defense Agency, when used for personal or unofficial purposes, are known as Class B telephone services. This includes telephone services provided by government-owned or government-leased facilities, or procured under contract, or implied agreement, with a commercial communications company.

The use of Class B telephone services is required to be charged to the user. Class B telephone rates are subdivided and identified as Class B-1 and Class B-2 unofficial telephones, as defined below. The FY 1998 monthly rates for Class B-1 and B-2 unofficial telephone services in overseas locations, which are effective October 1, 1997, are as follows:

Class B-1: \$22.95

Class B-2: \$40.65

Class B-1: Installed in government-owned or government-leased quarters assigned, or used for family or personal use in private or rental housing occupied by DoD personnel.

Class B-2: Installed at a military location for the use of activities such as public schools; Boy Scouts; Girl Scouts; American Red Cross; nonappropriated fund instrumentalities such as noncommissioned officers' and officers' messes; nurseries; thrift shops; motion picture services; exchanges; credit unions and commercial contractors, concessionaires, and other profit or non-profit organizations, operating on behalf of the Department of Defense whether within, or in the immediate vicinity of, a DoD installation.
