

This reprogramming action transfers \$75.0 million from the Iraq Freedom Fund (IFF), 04/06, appropriation to the Operation and Maintenance, Army, 05/05, appropriation (\$44.079 million) and Other Procurement, Army, 05/07, appropriation (\$30.921 million). This transfer is in accordance with provisions in Title IX of Public Law 108-287, the DoD Appropriations Act, 2005.

**Explanation:** This action provides funding to implement a critical force protection initiative for base access in Iraq. This transfer will finance the equipment and manpower to provide enrollment, vetting, smartcard issuance, and verification and screening for all non-US personnel, prioritizing Iraqis to come on the ten most threatened and/or strategically important forward operating bases (FOBs) in Iraq—including satellite bases—to start enrolling/vetting Iraqis and third party nationals for base access. On the heels of the Mosul bombing, the DepSecDef requested an initiative to address the critical problem of base access in Iraq. The Biometrics Identification for Secure Access (BISA) program is a critically important force protection initiative for base access in Iraq. An initial \$15 million was earmarked to the Multi-Purpose Access Card (MPAC) for the collection of biometric information and vetting of all Iraqi police. This transfer (\$75 million) targets the entire threat population in Iraq. The BISA program prioritizes Iraqis (local nationals) who wish to enter U.S. and Coalition FOBs for work purposes. These citizens will have their biometric information enrolled into the system and vetted through the Biometrics Fusion Center (a Department of Defense repository in Clarksburg, West Virginia, in alliance with the Federal Bureau of Investigation), which will subsequently allow these individuals for a base access card upon clearance.
