The equipment will include electronic countermeasures (ECM) equipment, radars, x-ray equipment, explosive ordnance disposal equipment, robots, surveillance equipment, physical security equipment, armored vehicles, and body and vehicle armor. Equipment procurement will benefit all deployed forces in theater, regardless of which Service may ultimately retain the equipment in inventory.
