They meet all administrative and legal requirements and none of the items have previously been denied by the Congress.

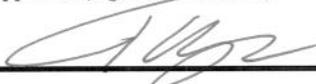
**Part I** transfers \$2.158 million from the Defense Health Program (DHP), Research, Development, Test, and Evaluation, 06/07, appropriation to the DHP, Operation and Maintenance, 06/06, appropriation (\$1.060 million) and the DHP, Procurement, 06/08, appropriation (\$1.098 million) for the Bethesda Hospital Emergency Preparedness Partnership.

**Part II** transfers \$2.8 million from the DHP, Operation and Maintenance, 06/06, appropriation to the DHP, Procurement, 06/08, appropriation for proper execution of the Theater Enterprise Wide Logistics System (TEWLS).

This reprogramming action uses \$3.898 million of general transfer authority pursuant to section 8005 of Public Law 109-148, the Department of Defense (DoD) Appropriations, Emergency Supplemental Appropriations to Address Hurricanes in the Gulf of Mexico, and Pandemic Influenza Act, 2006; and section 1001 of Public Law 109-163, the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2006.

Explanation: The theater enterprise wide logistics system (TEWLS) was budgeted as DHP O&M in FY 2006. A legal review conducted in August 2006 revealed that the requirements necessitate the use of procurement funds. The funding supports the capital lease of the computer servers that form the system's backbone. Therefore, this reprogramming action transfers the \$2.8 million to the DHP Procurement, 06/08, appropriation for proper execution for the TEWLS.
