

Explanation: These funds are being made available to fund a near-term, proto-type power solution that will result in a more capable on-board mobile power system consisting of a higher ampere alternator and a Commercial Off-the-Shelf (COTS) inverter. New capabilities to detect and counter enemy threats installed on Armored HMMWV (UAH) and the RG-31 Combat Utility Vehicles (CC-0120) in use in Iraq and Afghanistan demand greater voltage and amperage than legacy vehicle platforms can provide.
