

This reprogramming action is submitted for prior approval because it uses general transfer authority, exceeds established reprogramming thresholds, and involves a congressional special interest item. This action transfers \$1.0 million from the Operation and Maintenance, Army, 07/07, appropriation to the Operation and Maintenance, Defense-Wide, 07/07, appropriation for the Item Unique Identification (IUID) program. In addition, it realigns \$27.9 million within the Research, Development, Test, and Evaluation, Army, 07/08, appropriation for the Future Combat Systems (FCS) and realigns \$20.583 million within the Research, Development, Test, and Evaluation, Defense-Wide, 07/08, appropriation for the Chemical and Biological Defense Program. This reprogramming action uses \$1.0 million of general transfer authority pursuant to section 8005 of Public Law 109-289, the Department of Defense Appropriations Act, 2007; and section 1001 of Public Law 109-364, the John Warner National Defense Authorization Act for FY 2007. This action reprograms funding in support of higher priority items, based on unforeseen military requirements, than those for which originally appropriated; and is determined to be necessary in the national interest. It meets all administrative and legal requirements and none of the items have previously been denied by the Congress.
