

This includes \$75.0 million for additional Red River Army Depot civilian mechanics to support Regional Support Activities and \$45.0 million is needed for leases of non-tactical vehicles in support of MRAP fielding and sustainment, additional repair parts and logistics sustainment support at Logistics Command in Albany, New York.
