This reprogramming action is submitted in two parts. These transfers are pursuant to the authority provided by section 8122 of Public Law 110-116, the Department of Defense (DoD) Appropriations Act, 2008. It supports urgent warfighting needs for the protection of operating forces in Iraq and Afghanistan.

**Part I** transfers back \$376.0 million of Fiscal Year (FY) 2008 unobligated balances from various Component's Procurement and Operation and Maintenance appropriations to the Mine Resistant Ambush Protected (MRAP) Vehicle Fund, 08/08, appropriation. The FY 2008 unobligated balances include MRAP supplemental funding.

**Part II** transfers \$776.0 million from the MRAP Vehicle Fund, 08/08, appropriation to various Defense appropriations to upgrade vehicles with safety and survivability enhancements and repair and sustain vehicles in theater.



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Explanation: Funds will be used to procure safety and survivability enhancements such as gunner restraints, seat upgrades, overhead wire mitigation, and air conditioning upgrades for Army vehicles. Equipment upgrades include the Remote Weapon Station (RWS), Vanguard, Boomerang, and Long Range Advance Scout Surveillance System (LRAS3).

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Explanation: Funds will be used to procure and retrofit safety and survivability upgrades such as RPG protection, overhead wire mitigation, seat and axle upgrades and additional fire protection, air-conditioning upgrades for 270 U.S. Special Operations Command (USSOCOM) vehicles already procured. Funds will also be used to provide tow and recovery capability for selected USSOCOM vehicles.

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Explanation: The MRAP program is a critical priority Joint Service program. These funds will be made available to the MRAP Joint Program Office to procure safety and survivability enhancements for all Components and U.S. Special Operations Command (USSOCOM) vehicles already procured. Funds also provide tow and recovery capability for selected USSOCOM vehicles.
