This prior approval reprogramming action is submitted for prior approval because these actions use general transfer authority and exceed thresholds.

**Part I** of this reprogramming action realigns \$65.6 million within the Procurement of Ammunition, Army, 08/10, appropriation for ammunition procurement for troops in Operations Iraqi Freedom and Enduring Freedom.

**Part II** of this reprogramming action transfers \$107.5 million among Army appropriations. This reprogramming action uses \$27.0 million of general transfer authority pursuant to section 8005 of Public Law 109-289, the Department of Defense (DoD) Appropriations Act, 2007; and section 1001 of Public Law 109-364, the John Warner National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year (FY) 2007.

These actions reprogram funding in support of higher priority items, based on unforeseen military requirements, than those for which originally appropriated; and are determined to be necessary in the national interest. They meet all administrative and legal requirements and none of the items has been previously denied by the Congress.



**Procurement of Ammunition, Army, 08/10**

Explanation: Funds are needed to procure the 5.56mm lead free round that has been under development by PEO-Ammo. This revised 5.56mm round has significantly increased lethality in Close Quarters Combat, as well as increased penetration at longer ranges. The round was designed to address field concerns about the lack of incapacitation capability of current 5.56mm rounds. In addition to significantly increased lethality, the round is also environmentally friendly in training due to the removal of lead from the round. The Army intends to transition all 5.56mm ball and tracer ammo to lead free over time.

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Explanation: Funds are required to procure the M789, 30mm High Explosive, Dual Purpose ammunition used in the Apache aircraft. This round is being used extensively in OEF and OIF to support air to ground operations providing day and night anti-vehicle and anti-personnel capability. All rounds are currently being sent directly to theater and funding is needed to preclude a break in production that would severely impact current operations.

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Explanation: Funds are available due to decreased expenditures of Aircraft Flares in current operations because of upgrades to software in the Common Missile Warning System (CMWS). Additionally, the Army is pursuing procurement of new flares which will replace all or some of the current three flare system with a single or two flare mix.

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Explanation: Funds are available due to decreased expenditures in 25mm Bradley training. Funds will be realigned to 30mm to support the high operational expenditures of this round in GWOT.

Explanation: The additional funds allow procurement of Joint Urgent Operational Needs Statement (JUONS) validated requirements for Explosive Detection Equipment (EDE) for force protection in support of Operations Iraqi Freedom and Enduring Freedom (OIF/OEF). As units operate from more dispersed locations, there is a greater need for stand alone explosive detection equipment to screen both cargo and personnel for explosives. The Army Resource and Requirements Board validated the JUONS EDE requirement and this reprogramming resources 48 Military Mobile Vehicle and Cargo Inspection Systems (MMVACIS).
