This prior approval reprogramming action is submitted for prior approval because these actions use general transfer authority, exceed thresholds, and are congressional special interest items.

**Part I** of this reprogramming action transfers \$14.0 million among various Navy appropriations. This reprogramming action uses \$14.0 million of general transfer authority pursuant to section 8005 of Public Law 110-116, the Department of Defense (DoD) Appropriations Act, 2008.

**Part II** of this reprogramming action transfers \$36.9 million among various Navy appropriations. This reprogramming action uses \$36.9 million of general transfer authority pursuant to section 8005 of Public Law 109-289, the Department of Defense (DoD) Appropriations Act, 2007; and section 1001 of Public Law 109-364, the John Warner National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year (FY) 2007.


These actions reprogram funding in support of higher priority items, based on unforeseen military requirements, than those for which originally appropriated; and are determined to be necessary in the national interest. They meet all administrative and legal requirements and none of the items has been previously denied by the Congress.

Explanation: The Advanced Precision Kill Weapon System (APKWS) program requires additional Research, Development, Test, and Evaluation, Navy funding in FY 2008 for the continuation of System Development and Demonstration (SDD). Funding has been programmed across the Future Years Defense Program for the completion of SDD and subsequent procurement. The APKWS program is a system that provides precision guidance to current legacy 2.75” rockets for use by Marine Corps combat units.

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The ability to leverage existing inventory of 2.75” rockets, warheads, and launchers and logistics support infrastructure will allow the Marine Corps to defeat Global War on Terrorism threats and will meet an immediate wartime need. The APKWS program is low risk because the Army has been developing this system since 2004, and it has been demonstrated on an operational Marine Corps AH-1W Helicopter.
