This reprogramming action is submitted for prior approval because it exceeds established thresholds and uses general transfer authority pursuant to section 8005 of Public Law 110-116, the Department of Defense (DoD) Appropriations Act, 2008; and section 1001 of Public Law 110-181, the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year (FY) 2008. This reprogramming action transfers \$100.0 million from the Other Procurement, Army, 08/10, appropriation to the Research Development, Test, and Evaluation, Navy, 08/09, appropriation to support Mine Resistant Ambush Protection (MRAP) All Terrain Vehicle (M-ATV) prototype testing and Capability Insertion/Retrofit Upgrade design and ballistic testing. This action reprograms funding in support of higher priority items, based on unforeseen military requirements, than those for which originally appropriated, and is determined to be necessary in the national interest. It meets all administrative and legal requirements and none of the items has been previously denied by the Congress.

These funds are available for reprogramming based on the program schedule for retrofit upgrades; in order to maintain the retrofit installation plan based on vehicle availability in Theater, payback of these funds will be requested at a later time.
