This reprogramming action is submitted for approval because these actions use general transfer authority, pursuant to section 8005 of Public Law 111-118, the Department of Defense (DoD) Appropriations Act, 2010, and section 1001 of Public Law 111-84, the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year (FY) 2010. This reprogramming action provides funding in support of higher priority items, based on unforeseen military requirements, than those for which originally appropriated, and is determined to be necessary in the national interest. It meets all administrative and legal requirements and none of the items has been previously denied by the Congress.

Explanation: This action transfers funding from the Defense Health Program (DHP), Operation and Maintenance, 10/10, appropriation, to the Defense Health Program, Procurement, 10/12, appropriation, for medical equipment purchases to support advancements in medical technology and standards of practice for the treatment of Wounded, Ill and Injured service members. The Military Health System (MHS) intends to use these funds to enhance surgical capabilities by integrating medical devices in military treatment facility (MTF) operating rooms and to invest in state of the art scanning equipment to improve diagnostic capabilities. Additionally, the MHS will invest in Information Technologies (IT) to establish a joint medical network among MTF's in the National Capital Region and IT infrastructure at various MTF's to help stabilize and improve the reliability of medical IT applications. This reprogramming will allow the MHS to adjust to evolving medical advances in the treatment of our Wounded, Ill, and Injured.

Explanation: This action transfers funding from Defense Health Program (DHP), Operation and Maintenance, 10/10, appropriation, to the Defense Health Program, Research, Development, Test, and Evaluation (RDT&E), 10/11, appropriation for intramural and extramural research projects in the areas of traumatic brain injury, psychological health, eye injury, extremity trauma (to include amputation), and other battlefield injuries. Funds will be applied to research projects that have been reviewed for military relevancy and scientific merit. In addition, funds will be utilized for capital research equipment investments at military laboratories, centers of excellence, and military treatment facilities that support on-going and new research efforts of wounded active duty members.
