
This reprogramming action is submitted for prior approval because it exceeds established thresholds and uses general transfer authority pursuant to section 8005 of Public Law 111-118, the Department of Defense (DoD) Appropriations Act, 2010; and section 1001 of Public Law 111-84, the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year (FY) 2010. This action transfers \$90.0 million from the Operation and Maintenance, Army 10/10; appropriation and \$30 million from the Operation and Maintenance Defense Wide, 10/10; appropriation to the Overseas Humanitarian, Disaster Assistance, and Civic Aid, Defense (OHDACA), 10/11 appropriation. This action reprograms funds in support of higher priority items, based on unforeseen military requirements, than those for which originally appropriated; and is determined to be necessary in the national interest. It meets all administrative and legal requirements and none of the items has been previously denied by the Congress.

Explanation: Funds are required for urgent humanitarian assistance and disaster relief efforts. The DoD is participating in the Department of State coordinated response to the Pakistan flooding that began on August 1, 2010. The DoD role is primarily to provide air transportation for rescue operations and delivery of supplies and materials. Depending upon the extent of this natural disaster, the DoD role could expand in scope and a subsequent reprogramming action may be necessary.
