SUBJECT: Interim Change to the Department of Defense Financial Management Regulation  
(DoDFMR), Volume 7A, Regarding Clothing Monetary Allowance Rates for  
Fiscal Year 2005 (DFAS Item N-23)

Attached is Interim Change 30-04 to the DoDFMR, Volume 7A. This change incorporates Fiscal Year 2005 clothing monetary allowance rates issued by the Principal Deputy Under Secretary of Defense for Personnel and Readiness into Chapter 29. The effective date of this change is October 1, 2004.

## NOTES:

- By law, an officer is authorized a civilian clothing allowance only if the officer's permanent duty station is outside the United States.
- Unless exception is given, the maximum amount payable for all temporary duty performed in any 36-month period will not exceed the maximum prescribed for duty of at least 30 days.
- The 15-day qualification requirement does not apply to explosive Ordnance Disposal and Explosive Detector Dog personnel on United States Secret Service support duty, Defense Courier Service couriers, or Defense Threat Reduction Agency military personnel. These personnel may be authorized up to the maximum Temporary Duty Civilian Clothing Allowance for 30 days upon their initial temporary duty travel requirement.
