CHAPTER 31

PERSONAL MONEY ALLOWANCE3101 ENTITLEMENT

310101. Officers. Officers in the capacities listed in Table 31-1, who are entitled to receive basic pay, are also entitled to receive a personal money allowance. This allowance is in addition to any other pay or allowance authorized.

310102. Enlisted Members. An enlisted member, serving as the senior enlisted member of his or her Military Service, is also entitled to receive a personal money allowance. This allowance is in addition to any other pay or allowance authorized.

★3102 MONTHLY AMOUNTS PAYABLE

3103 TAXABILITY AND WITHHOLDING TAX

Personal money allowance is subject to federal and state income tax withholding.
