OVERVIEW

The Fiscal Year (FY) 2025 European Deterrence Initiative (EDI) budget request of \$2.91 billion continues to support rotational force deployments, infrastructure investments, and deliver the right capabilities in key locations throughout Europe (i.e., Air Force-European Contingency Air Operations Sets (ECAOS), Army Prepositioned Stocks (APS), etc.). While EDI is not a separate funding source and part of the base, it remains an important method to identify specific investments in the base budget that support deterring Russian aggression against NATO and align with the same five EDI lines of effort since 2014. The EDI investments build upon the successes already achieved from continued operations, activities, and investments in the European theater.

Initiatives within the FY 2025 EDI request continue to:

- 1 Enhance the capability and readiness of U.S. Forces, North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) Allies, and regional partners of the U.S., to enable a faster response to any aggression within the U.S. European Command (USEUCOM) Area of Responsibility (AOR) and transnational threats by regional adversaries to the sovereign territory of NATO Allies.
- 2 Bolster the security and capacity of our NATO Allies and partners, enabling Allied investments pertaining to Article 3 responsibilities and assuring the United States' commitment to Article 5 and the territorial integrity of all NATO nations.
- 3 Improve Continuity of Operations, ECAOS, and APS capabilities.

The FY 2025 EDI request continues to enhance the security posture in Europe and readiness to defend against Russian aggression against NATO nations by filling prepositioned sets and conducting rotational training and exercises. Lastly, as the Department of Defense maximizes and aligns resources to the National Defense Strategy (NDS) priorities, the EDI budget continues to invest in integrated deterrence, campaigning, and actions that build enduring advantages.

The FY 2025 EDI request is \$719 million less than the FY 2024 request. The FY 2025 request captures reduced direct and support costs due to the off-year of a large-scale global exercise and the Army reduction in Reserve Component man-year costs as they source most of the rotational requirements in Europe with Active Component units in FY 2025. As the Department continues to enhance security posture and readiness, we will seek opportunities with NATO, Allies, and partners to share the cost of our common objectives when possible.

The FY 2025 EDI request supports a subset of the U.S. forces in Europe. EDI funding supports 11,252 active, reserve, and guard personnel within USEUCOM, including 10,350 Army, 409 Air Force, 63 Navy, and 430 U.S. Marine Corps personnel. These personnel will participate in multiple activities throughout the European theater, including rotations to maintain an increased military presence, support planned exercises to enhance NATO interoperability and various other multinational training events.

The FY 2025 request includes investments and activities that support the deterrence of Russian aggression against NATO through five principal lines of efforts (LOEs): (1) Increased Presence, (2) Exercises and Training, (3) Enhanced Prepositioning, (4) Improved Infrastructure, and (5) Building Partner Capacity.

INCREASED PRESENCE (\$1,556.2 million): The persistent presence of air, land, and sea forces throughout Europe is the cornerstone of the United States' firm commitment to NATO Article 5, supporting the defense of our European Allies. This line of effort (LOE) focuses on activities that deter Russian aggression against NATO by deploying rotational forces from the United States, repositioning forces already stationed in the USEUCOM AOR and sustaining rotational forces in the eastern countries of NATO. Funding will support force deployments to NATO's eastern flank from forces forward-stationed in USEUCOM and maintain ongoing force rotations from the United States (U.S.) (e.g., Combat Air Forces and Mobility Air Forces presence, NATO Forward Land Forces (FLF), and special operations forces (SOF) presence).

The FY 2025 request realigns operations and maintenance appropriations supporting FLFs previously accounted for in the Enhance Prepositioning line of effort to Increase Presence line of effort for NATO Enhanced Forward Presence (EFP). The FY 2025 Air Force adjustments in persistent Combat Air Force (CAF) presence will continue support for exercise participation and maintaining the CAF presence. Additionally, the Air Force increased support to installation operations and security in Airbase Air Defense Systems activities. For personnel, this LOE includes incremental costs for military and civilian personnel and additional Reserve Component man-years for increase presence, exercises and training, and building partner capacity. The EDI Military Personnel request is \$174M lower than the FY 2024 request, which reflects the reduced utilization of Reserve and Guard personnel to source Army rotational requirements.

ARMY (\$1,247.6 million)

- Army Rotational Forces. Supports the Combatant Commander's requirement for a rotational Armored Brigade Combat Team (ABCT) presence, including operational and tactical level mission command elements, a Division Headquarters forward element, and combat support and service support enablers. The ABCT rotates from the Continental United States (CONUS) based armored forces. The ABCT and USEUCOM assigned Infantry and Stryker Brigade Combat Teams ensure a U.S. presence across Eastern Europe, including the Baltic States, Poland, Romania, and Bulgaria. Additionally, this funding integrates a greater diversity of capabilities to meet NATO FLF presence and training objectives by allowing access to Army National Guard and Army Reserve units. Funds three main programs to support in-theater presence:
 - ABCT: Transportation, life support, temporary duty (TDY), and operations tempo (OPTEMPO);
 - Mission Command: Operational level Headquarters, Division Headquarters Forward, and others; and
 - Enablers: Engineers, fires capability, sustainment capability, staff augmentation, including pay and allowances for extended annual training.
- Aviation Rotation. Supports a Combat Aviation Brigade (-) rotation to provide rotary wing aviation capability supporting USEUCOM-assigned missions. Specific capabilities include a Brigade Headquarters, Armed Reconnaissance Squadron (AH-64), General Support Aviation Battalion (CH-47/ air MEDEVAC), Assault Battalion (UH-60s), and Aviation Support Battalion. This integrates Army aviation assets into Operation Atlantic Resolve activities. Provides for transporting personnel and equipment for a Combat Aviation Brigade presence leveraging CONUS-based aviation, including transportation, flying hours, rotational aviation port operations, and aviation maintenance at embarkation and debarkation ports.

- Reserve Component Man-Years. Provides incremental pay for Active Component forces and resources required to support Reserve Component man-years to facilitate National Guard and Reserve support for rotational force requirements. Funds allowances for Active Component Soldiers, and pay, allowances, and health care for Reserve Component Soldiers mobilized on active duty.
- Integrated Air and Missile Defense (IAMD) Enhancements. Provides increased persistent ballistic/cruise missile capabilities for U.S. and NATO facilities in Europe. In addition, this request will continue the development of an integrated air and missile defense architecture and defense design for the USEUCOM AOR through modeling, simulation, and interoperability events with Allied and partner nations. Funds the associated costs to continue development of persistent surveillance systems and integrate U.S. and Allied IAMD architectures.
- Information Sharing Program. Supports an information environment monitoring capability to identify and assess issues, propaganda, and misinformation in support of rapid assessment and response activities. Funds contract personnel and monitoring tools in USEUCOM Operations Centers, including coordination with other relevant agencies.
- Intelligence Enhancements. Provides Intelligence, Surveillance, and Reconnaissance (ISR) capability to enhance indications and warnings (I&W) and interoperability with European Allies and partners. This initiative enables intelligence sharing with NATO partners and provides intelligence data via cross-domain solutions for land power ISR operations supporting USEUCOM theater requirements. Funds operations, personnel, and contract support for developing collection capabilities against adversarial targets. In addition, this initiative funds the modernization of manned ISR platforms, increases the Combatant Commander's situational awareness, supports joint and coalition operations, and augments theater-wide I&W.
- Support to NATO Forward Land Forces (FLF). Provides a U.S. battalion (+) to support NATO's FLF, composed of an autonomous Mechanized or Motorized Battle Group/Battalion Task Force with organic fires, air defense, and engineers. Provides funding to support a continuous rotation of the U.S. contribution to NATO FLF, including pay and allowances for National Guard support.

NAVY (\$0.6 million)

• Forward Deployable Task Force (TF). The forward deployable, all domain TF HQs provide increased presence and capacity to integrate maritime unmanned systems, space and cyber capabilities for target fusion, and support security force assistance. Capable of pivoting to any region within the AOR, the all-domain TF integrates rotational forces to support deterrence of Russian aggression against NATO.

AIR FORCE (\$244.5 million)

- **Persistent Combat Air Forces (CAF) Presence.** Continues CAF activities in various European countries and CONUS that complements U.S. Air Force engagements that deter aggression while assuring NATO of U.S. commitment. This initiative enables CAF training, exercises, and supported activities to present a persistent presence. Funded actives include flying operations, procurement, personnel costs, contracted air support, and other costs that enable CAF training and exercises in various European countries and CONUS; examples are but not limited to: Theater Security Packages; Air Policing and Surveillance activities; Airbase Air Defense Systems (ABADS) activities in support of power projection platforms, and Tactical Air Control Party (TACP) activities as CAF enablers.
- ISR Capability. Provides ISR capability to enhance Indications and Warnings (I&W); and enable Processing, Exploitation, and Dissemination (PED) of Intelligence information. This capability allows intelligence sharing with European partners, provides intelligence data sharing via cross-domain solutions. Capability supports MQ-9 operations, base operations support for U-2 operations, Air & Space Operations Center mission support, AFFOR C2 operations, Multi-Domain C2 operations, mission support, and travel in support of tactical Landing Systems employment.
- Persistent Mobility Air Forces (MAF) Presence. Continues MAF activities in various European countries. These MAF activities complement U.S. Air Forces Europe (USAFE) engagements that deter aggression while reassuring European Allies. This initiative enables MAF operations and supporting activities to facilitate the achievement of USEUCOM theater objectives and complement ongoing USAFE theater aerial refueling and C-130 airlift activities. Additionally, this initiative funds the personnel requirements needed to maintain MAF's presence and its activities.

DEFENSE-WIDE ACCOUNTS (\$63.5 million)

- Intelligence Enhancements. Maintains dedicated analytical support to provide timely Indications and Warnings (I&W) and exercise planning. This initiative funds intelligence sharing of immediate and mid-range I&W, all-source analysis, and open-source information supporting U.S. and NATO operations, exercises, and training. It enables the U.S. and its Allies to respond rapidly to the changing theater security environment and design tailored partner exercises in Europe.
- Intelligence Enhancements for Special Operations Forces (SOF). Supports intelligence efforts to enhance security, regional stability, and support global intelligence initiatives while strengthening NATO's collective defense. Advances SOF's ability to advise, assist, and train Allies and partner nations while simultaneously integrating, collaborating, and synchronizing analytical and operational intelligence requirements. Funds personnel and resources to (1) provide timely I&W throughout all phases of operations and activities; (2) provide information and assessments needed to plan and conduct future operations; (3) measure trends and determine focus areas for intelligence analysis and future operations; (4) coordinate and synchronize SOF intelligence and operational requirements within the analysis and intelligence community; (5) enhance U.S. presence to support exercises and training, and build partner capacity.

EXERCISES AND TRAINING (\$187.8 million): Participation in exercises and training (1) increases the overall readiness and interoperability of U.S. forces across all domains; (2) improves the interoperability of U.S. forces with our NATO Allies and theater partners; and (3) allows for a greater understanding of both the physical, and political, environments within which forces are operating. Examples include funding rotational and forward-stationed forces in USEUCOM that support deterrence and freedom-of-maneuver exercises, maritime exercises, and NATO Very High Readiness Joint Task Force exercises, not limited to events that USEUCOM undertakes to integrate deterrence across combatant command boundaries to address the Russian threat holistically.

The FY 2025 Exercises and Training LOE funding level, \$328.5M lower than the FY 2024 request, reflects a minor scale involvement in Exercise Defender during odd years in alignment with the rotation of the large-scale global exercise outside the European AOR.

ARMY (\$115.2 million)

- Exercise Defender. Primarily supports four combat credible forces-focused exercises: Swift Response, Immediate Response, Saber Strike, and Defender Castle. The Defender family of exercises demonstrates the U.S. Army's capability to aggregate combat power in Europe from CONUS rapidly and with assigned forces to reinforce the NATO Alliance. U.S. and European-based forces employed include ground and airborne Immediate Response Forces (IRF), rotational and assigned forces with associated strategic air and sea lift, intra-theater ground lines of communication, and Army Prepositioned Stocks. Funds the transportation, strategic airlift, and training costs of U.S.-based forces to include two Division Headquarters mission command nodes, one Expeditionary Sustainment Command Headquarters, and three other brigade combat teams in accordance with exercise requirements.
- U.S. Participation in NATO Exercises. U.S. Army Europe and Africa (USAREUR-AF) Headquarters participates in three NATO-led interoperability command post exercises, Steadfast Deterrence, Steadfast Duel, and Loyal Leda, to exercise command relationships with NATO Headquarters, build interoperability, and enhance partnerships across the Alliance. Each NATO exercise stimulates multi-echelons of the NATO command structure from Joint Force Command to Division level. Funds the transportation and life support for participating units.
- Continued Deterrence Exercises. Supports three recurring deterrence-focused exercises. Arctic Forge, Agile Spirit, and Noble Partner. Arctic Forge is an Arctic exercise that supports the U.S. Army and DoD Arctic Strategy by building U.S. Army Arctic unit readiness, exercising critical Arctic infrastructure, and building interoperability with Arctic allies and partners to deter in the Arctic. Agile Spirit and Noble Partner exercises improve Allies' and partners' military capabilities and interoperability to prevent in and around the Black Sea region. Additionally, it funds three short-notice action planning (SNAP) exercises to provide senior military and civilian leadership with immediate strategic impacts due to Eastern Europe's ongoing dynamic operational environment. Funds the transportation and training costs of the exercising units, including strategic airlift and materials for minor infrastructure projects.
- Enhanced Interoperability Exercises. Supports four interoperability-focused multi-echelon exercises with NATO Allies: Saber Junction, Combined Resolve, Allied Spirit, and Dynamic Front, along with several smaller exercises to set conditions for enhanced interoperability. These exercises are developed in conjunction with NATO Allies to improve interoperability at the Brigade and above level while focusing on deterring aggression against the NATO Alliance. Funds planning and exercise participation of U.S.-based forces, rotational forces, assigned Stryker and Infantry Brigade Combat Teams, and other fires, sustainment, aviation, and engineer enabler capabilities.
- **Higher Echelon Readiness Exercises.** Supports readiness-building exercises executed at the Corps and general officer command echelon:

Avenger Triad and Arcane Thunder. USAREUR-AF conducts various live, virtual, and constructive exercises to train the Corps and their staff for contingency operations in a joint, multi-domain operational environment. Avenger Triad is a multi-corps, Multi-domestic, multi-national command post-exercise using simulations focused on large-scale ground combat operations. Arcane Thunder is a European Multi-Domain Task Force exercise that employs new technologies to achieve operational effects in a live multi-domain environment.

• Training with Friendly Foreign Countries (TWFFC). Funds the travel, personnel support, lodging, food (rations and meals), fuel, equipment transportation, and training ammunition, as well as other reasonable partner nation incremental expenses associated with participating in a U.S.-led exercise in accordance with Title 10 U.S. Code Section 321. The 13 eligible partner nations in the USEUCOM AOR are Albania, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Georgia, Kosovo, Moldova, Montenegro, North Macedonia, Serbia, Turkey, and Ukraine.

NAVY (\$29.9 million)

- Exercise FORMIDABLE SHIELD. Exercise Formidable Shield is the Naval Striking and Supporting Forces NATO's (STRIKFORNATO's) live fire maritime Integrated Air and Missile Defense (IAMD) exercise. This event is focused on maritime component support to NATO Air Command in executing the NATO Ballistic Missile Defense (BMD) mission. Still, it will expand to validate the NATO BMD link architecture that includes Land component assets. Funds exercise planning and event preparation; ballistic missile and air defense scenario analysis; range services, safety, and integration expenses; ballistic missile and supersonic target maintenance; Naval Sea Systems Command support for participating U.S. ships; and TDY costs for U.S. participants.
- NATO Allies and Partners Multinational Exercises. Supports increased coherence in NATO alliance posture and capabilities in the Black and Baltic Sea regions and the Eastern Mediterranean by increasing the level of interaction between U.S. forces, NATO, NATO Partnership for Peace countries, and other allies and partners. Exercises supported include the Austere Challenge; Neptune Series; the Northern Exercise Portfolio (Baltic Operations (BALTOPS)), Northern Viking, Steadfast Defender, etc. Provides for exercises such as Joint Warrior to fund Fleet Live Fire with a Purpose (LFWAP) training and interoperability with allied navies and coalition partners for range support and target services for crew confidence

- and end-to-end system verification of Forward Deployed Naval Forces Europe. Provides funding for mission requirements, planning and exercise participation, transportation, sustainment, and training costs associated with planning and conducting the exercises.
- Reserve Component Man-Years. Provides Reserve Component man-years to facilitate and support exercises and engagements with NATO allies and partners. (Joint exercise planners, Maritime Assistance Officers, Theater Undersea Warfare (TUSW) operations managers, and Watch Standers). Funds pay and allowances for operational support.

ENHANCED PREPOSITIONING (\$713.2 million): Prepositioning of select equipment and materiel across all supply classes provides: (1) a local source of readily available resources that support the increased level of activities occurring in theater and (2) a set of ready and able equipment for U.S. based forces to draw in response to adversarial activities in theater. This LOE is focused on prepositioning selected equipment, supplies, and materials in Europe to address capability gaps and improve response timelines for responding to potential Russian attacks against NATO. Examples include improvements to Army Prepositioned Stocks, Air Force European Contingency Air Operations Sets Deployable Airbase System, Rapid Airfield Damage Recovery (RADR) sets, costs to sustain/maintain prepositioned equipment sets, and increased prepositioned munitions, and deployable command, control, and communication (C3) systems.

The FY 2025 request realigns operations and maintenance appropriations supporting FLFs previously accounted for in the Enhance Prepositioning line of effort to Increase Presence line of effort for NATO Enhanced Forward Presence.

ARMY (\$535.6 million)

- Army Prepositioned Stocks Unit Set Requirements. Supports the continued build of a division-sized prepositioned set of equipment with corpslevel enablers in Europe that is planned to contain two ABCTs (one of which is modernized), two Fires Brigades, air defense, engineer, movement control, sustainment, and medical units. In conflict, prepositioned sets reduce the demands on strategic transportation assets and the risk of enemy interdiction. This includes funds to modernize and, where necessary, acquire vehicles for the European threat, transport equipment from CONUS to storage facilities, and restore and update facilities to receive the equipment. Funding has been included to accelerate the build of sustainment and medical assets critical to theater settings and port openings and increase survivability by fielding vehicle protection systems to one brigade of tanks within the set and additional war stock ammunition for the unit sets.
- Chemical, Biological, Radiological, and Nuclear (CBRN) Readiness. Supports developing, coordinating, and managing Chemical, Biological, Radiological, and Nuclear (CBRN) deliberate plans, policies, agreements, and Memorandums of Understanding (MOUs) for USAREUR-AF. Provides planning and execution of exercises and the modernization of theater stocks and equipment to field assigned forces and projected forces in sustained contested operations.
- USEUCOM Munitions Starter Stocks. Prepositions critical munitions in the USEUCOM AOR for employment during a contingency event. Funds the procurement of Patriot Missile Segment Enhancement (MSE) and other critical munitions starter set prepositioning in the USEUCOM AOR.

DEFENSE-WIDE ACCOUNTS (\$8.8 million)

- Special Operations Forces (SOF) Staging Capabilities and Prepositioning. Supports the deployment of SOF forces into the theater to preposition selected equipment across the USEUCOM AOR, reducing the risk to the forces and mission. Additionally, this will reduce the challenges of conducting sustainment and resupply operations in a contested environment. Funds equipment procurement and contract personnel to support the proposition of SOF equipment to support SOF Joint Reception, Staging, Onward Movement, and Integration (JRSO&I) requirements.
- Chemical, Biological, Radiological, and Nuclear (CBRN) Defense. Protects USEUCOM, Components, & Allies from Chemical, Biological, Radiological, and Nuclear (CBRN) threats. Funding modernizes CBRN defenses to ensure forces are prepared to defend against rising AOR threats. This includes increasing staff at the headquarters and component levels, integrating CBRN defenses into training exercises, improving interoperability with NATO Allies, and placing/purchasing sensor networks to feed a "Common Operating Picture" on the JADC2 network.

IMPROVED INFRASTRUCTURE (\$318.6 million). The investment of resources to improve infrastructure and facilities throughout the European theater provides our Allies, partners, and potential adversaries a clear indication of the United States' long-term commitment to Europe. Access to robust infrastructure at critical locations is essential to support military activities and operations. The planned improvements support military readiness in the region; support various activities and events; and improve theater Joint Reception Staging Onward Movement and Integration (JRSO&I) capabilities. This LOE focuses on JRSO&I for contingency plans in Europe. Examples include facilities to store prepositioned equipment, munitions, and fuel; facilities for rotational units; training facilities and ranges; improved reception and movement infrastructure; operational facilities; airfield infrastructure; and intelligence, network, and surveillance architecture.

The restoration and modernization of infrastructure and facilities continue across the European theater. In FY 2025, the MILCON appropriation will be reduced due to the reprioritization of projects. The FY 2025 EDI request includes one military construction project for the Air Force, estimated at \$110 million.

ARMY (\$126.3 million)

- Army Prepositioned Stocks (APS) Facilities Modernization. Supports the execution of various restoration and modernization projects throughout the European theater, including real property repairs, renovations, and planning and design costs associated with modernizing aging facilities supporting pre-positioning stocks in Europe.
- Unspecified Minor Military Construction. Supports the execution of various projects throughout the European theater, which will cost less than \$9 million each to construct. Provides resources necessary to sustain and restore critical facilities for operations and pre-positioned war reserve materials. Supports planning and design to support future military construction at various locations throughout the European theater.
- USEUCOM Continuity of Operations (COOP). Supports a coordinated, resourced, and exercised continuity capability to maintain its mission-essential functions and tasks.

- Infrastructure Enhancements to Support ECAOS/ACE. Continues to improve ECAOS and ACE airfield infrastructure and prepositioned storage capability to support U.S. Air Force in Europe operations, actions, and activities. Includes Facilities, Sustainment, Restoration, and Modernization (FSRM) funding for airfield infrastructure. This initiative will help set the theater and enable the execution of current operations, training, exercises, and contingencies. Additionally, this initiative provides appropriations to fund operating and personnel requirements to allow infrastructure enhancements. This includes communications capability and interoperability requirements; National Guard Bureau (NGB) or Reserve Component (ARC) manpower support, contract support; Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures development; Command, Control, Communications, Computers, and Intelligence (C4I) infrastructure requirements; and other expenses to facilitate successful service employment.
- Communications Infrastructure. Includes communications infrastructure and Mission Partner Environment (MPE) network infrastructure, protection to defend the network, and data and applications using the infrastructure to execute the Air Force mission. This includes communications manpower support, contract support; Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures development; Command, Control, Communications, Computers, and Intelligence (C4I) infrastructure requirements; and other expenses to facilitate successful service employment.
- Unspecified Minor Military Construction. Provides the Department of the Air Force funds to execute various projects throughout the European theater.

BUILDING PARTNER CAPACITY (\$136.0 million). Building the capacity of European Allies and partners: (1) improves their ability to defend themselves in times of crisis; (2) enables their full participation as operational partners in responding to crises in the region; and (3) improves the interoperability of host nation and U.S. forces, both in peacetime and in times of conflict. Examples of this LOE include investments in multinational information-sharing systems, Security Force Assistance Brigade activities, Forward Land Forces (FLF) mission networks, and air and maritime domain awareness.

The FY 2025 EDI request increases resources to build the capacity of our NATO Allies by \$38.5 million. The additional resources support operations and activities of the Army's Security Force Assistance Brigade in Europe and Air Force investments to improve theater command and control (C2) interoperability and intelligence data amongst critical NATO Allies in the region.

ARMY (\$63.7 million)

- Security Force Assistance Brigade Activities. The 4th Security Force Assistance Brigade (SFAB) builds European Allies' and partners' capabilities, capacity, and interoperability across the USEUCOM AOR through advising, supporting, liaising, and assisting USEUCOM-directed missions. The 4th SFAB activities with Allies and partners include but are not limited to preparing for NATO Combat Readiness Evaluations, multi-national exercises, training on Foreign Military Sales equipment, and enhancing NATO battle group interoperability with U.S. Forces.
- Multinational Information Sharing. Provides funds to enhance and sustain a compilation of Mission Partner Environment (MPE) network enclaves, including the Atlantic Resolve Mission network, FLF Mission Network, Maritime Mission Enclave, and the Maidan Network. Funds the sustainment of the Maidan Network, allowing for sensitive but unclassified (SBU) secure U.S. communication with partners. Provides funds to expand capabilities associated with the Operation Atlantic Resolve and NATO FLF missions and future interoperability with the NATO Federated Mission Networking (FMN) construct.

Supports resources, organizations, activities, and procedures that provide intelligence support to NATO nations integrating U.S. Air Force theater C2 and other theater elements, including manpower authorizations, Combat Air Intelligence System (CAIS) activities, European Partner Integration Enterprise (EPIE) activates, Distributed Common Ground/Surface System (DCGS) support equipment, facility support and associated costs identifiable to Air Intelligence Squadrons, Intelligence Centers.
