<p>This internal reprogramming action transfers funds from Research Development, Test, and Evaluation, Army (RDT&E,A), 99/00, to Procurement of Ammunition, Army, 99/01, and Other Procurement, Army, 99/01; and realigns funds within RDT&E, A, for the proper execution of various items identified as Force XXI Initiatives - Warfighting Rapid Acquisition Program (WRAP). It does not represent a change from the purpose or funding approved by the Congress. This action requires the use of general transfer authority, pursuant to section 8005 of Public Law 105-262, the DoD Appropriations Act, 1999, and section 1001 of Public Law 105-261, the Strom Thurmond National Defense Authorization Act for FY 1999. It meets all administrative and legal requirements of the Congress and has not previously been denied by the Congress. This action does not affect Tactical Intelligence and Related Activities, Joint Military Intelligence Programs, or the National Foreign Intelligence Program. This action is not reflected in the FY 2000 President's budget.</p>
