<p>This internal reprogramming action transfers \$345.8 million from the Spares, Repairs and Associated Logistical Support Transfer Fund, Defense, 99/00, to the Components' Operation and Maintenance appropriations to meet the most urgent readiness-related requirements consistent with the provisions and authority enacted by Title II, Chapter 3, section 2007 of Public Law 106-31, the FY 1999 Emergency Supplemental Appropriations Act. This realignment does not change the purpose for which the funds were originally appropriated. This transfer authority is in addition to other transfer authorities. It meets all administrative and legal requirements of the Congress and has not previously been denied by the Congress. This action does not affect the National Foreign Intelligence Program, the Tactical Intelligence and Related Activities (TIARA), or the Joint Military Intelligence Programs (JMIP). This action is not reflected in the FY 2000 President's budget.</p>

Funds for ship spares (\$14.4 million) will be used to eliminate critical backlogs of shipboard spares on surface and subsurface combatants. The ships spares replacement meets demand based on projected failure rates of shipboard weapons and engineering systems through FY 1999.</p>
