<p>This internal reprogramming action transfers \$12.0 million to the correct appropriation for proper execution of Weapons of Mass Destruction requirements. This transfer does not change the purpose for which the funds were originally appropriated. This action requires the use of general transfer authority, pursuant to section 8005 of Public Law 105-262, the DoD Appropriations Act, 1999, and section 1001 of Public Law 105-261, the Strom Thurmond National Defense Authorization Act for FY 1999. It meets all administrative and legal requirements of the Congress and has not previously been denied by the Congress. This action does not affect Tactical Intelligence and Related Activities (TIARA), Joint Military Intelligence Programs (JMIP), or the National Foreign Intelligence Program (NFIP). It is not reflected in the FY 2000 President's budget.</p>

<p><u>Explanation:</u> The original expenditure plan for Weapons of Mass Destruction requirements in the FY 1999 Omnibus Consolidated and Emergency Supplemental Act included \$4.8 million for 12 Mobile Analytical Laboratory Systems and \$7.2 million for partial funding of 12 unified command sites. Funds were provided in the Operation and Maintenance, Army National Guard, FY 1999, appropriation rather than the Other Procurement, Army, 99/01, appropriation. This action will realign funding for proper execution.</p>
