<p>This prior approval reprogramming action transfers funds from the Defense Working Capital Fund to the Department's centralized Drug Interdiction and Counter-Drug Activities, FY 1999, appropriation to support the removal and reconstitution of counterdrug operations as a result of the implementation of the Panama Canal Treaty. This reprogramming action is submitted for prior approval because it reprograms funding in support of a higher priority item, based on unforeseen military requirements, than that for which the funds were originally appropriated. This action requires the use of general transfer authority, pursuant to section 8005, Public Law 105-262, the FY 1999 DoD Appropriations Act, and section 1001 of Public Law 105-261, the FY 1999 National Defense Authorization Act. It meets all administrative and legal requirements and has not previously been denied by the Congress. This action does not affect Tactical Intelligence and Related Activities (TIARA), Joint Military Intelligence Programs (JMIP), or the National Foreign Intelligence Program (NFIP). This action is not reflected in the FY 2000/2001 President's budget.</p>

<p><u>Explanation:</u> These funds will permit the Department to establish up to three Forward Operation Locations (FOLs) in the source and transit zones and to relocate various critical counterdrug support components to the United States and Puerto Rico from Panama. This supports two major goals of the National Counterdrug Strategy -- shielding America's frontiers and breaking the drug sources of supply.</p>
