This prior approval reprogramming action transfers \$12.039 million from the Intelligence Electronic Warfare Ground Based Common Sensor (IEW/GBCS) program in the Other Procurement, Army, 99/01, appropriation to the Research, Development, Test, and Evaluation, Navy, 99/00, appropriation. IEW/GBCS is a congressional special interest item. This action uses general transfer authority pursuant to section 8005 of Public Law 105-262, the DoD Appropriations Act, 1999, and section 1001 of Public Law 105-261, the Strom Thurmond National Defense Authorization Act for FY 1999. It is not reflected in the FY 2000 President's Budget.

<u>Explanation</u>. The development of the communications intelligence (COMINT) component of the Marine Corps Mobile Electronic Warfare Support System Product Improvement Program (MEWSS-PIP) is closely tied to the Army's IEW/GBCS program. When GCBCS failed its developmental/operational test in May 1998 and the Army restructured the GBCS program as PROPHET, the MEWSS-PIP program was placed at considerable developmental and programmatic risk. As result, the Marine Corps reviewed their original requirement and the contractor's performance, and determined that the upgraded MEWSS-PIP capability was still required and achievable. A National Security Agency technical evaluation of the Marine Corps strategy expressed confidence that the proposed MEWSS-PIP development/fixes can be achieved and endorsed the Marine Corps assessment.

The development cost for MEWSS-PIP increased substantially with the Army's decision to cease GBCS development and to restructure GBCS into PROPHET. The Army has agreed in a signed Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to transfer \$12.039 million that was programmed for GBCS to the Marine Corps to enable the latter to complete the MEWSS-PIP COMINT development by FY 2001. In addition, the Army will provide the Marine Corps with a minimum of nine sensor sets of GBCS equipment and spares that are now in their inventory and valued at over \$50.0 million.
