<p>This internal reprogramming action transfers \$779.1 million from the Spares, Repairs, and Associated Logistical Support Transfer Fund, Defense, 99/00, to the Components' FY 2000 Operation and Maintenance appropriations and to Aircraft Procurement, Navy, FY 2000, to meet the most urgent readiness-related requirements. This action includes the restoration of the \$550 million reduction required by section 8170 of Public Law 106-79, the DoD Appropriations Act, 2000, which also directs a transfer of like amounts from funds appropriated in Public Law 106-31, the 1999 Emergency Supplemental Appropriations Act. This action is consistent with the provisions and authority enacted by Title II, Chapter 3, section 2007 of Public Law 106-31. This realignment does not change the purpose for which the funds were originally appropriated. This transfer authority is in addition to other transfer authorities. It meets all administrative and legal requirements of the Congress and has not previously been denied by the Congress.</p>

<p><u>Explanation:</u> These funds restore the \$170.0 million reduction to the FY 2000 appropriated amount for spares and repair parts and associated logistical support necessary for the maintenance of weapons systems and equipment in order to accomplish the Army's planned ground OPTEMPO training and associated maintenance.</p>

<u>Budget Activity 1: Operating Forces</u>						<b><u>+182,000</u></b>		
<p><u>Explanation:</u> These funds restore the \$170.0 million reduction to the FY 2000 appropriated amount for spares and repair parts. The remaining \$12.0 million will continue to reduce a critical backlog of shipboard spares on surface and sub-surface combatants. Meets demand based on projected failure rates of shipboard weapons and engineering systems through FY 2000.</p>

<u>Explanation:</u> These funds restore the \$148.7 million reduction to the FY 2000 appropriated amount for spares and repair parts. Funding supports both new and accumulated spares requirements due to aging weapon systems, high OPTEMPO, force structure changes, and constrained funding. This will provide spare parts needed to improve/sustain mission capable rates (MCR). Without funding, MCR will continue to decline and adversely affect the combat capability of the operating commands.								
<u>Budget Activity 2: Mobilization</u>						<b>+12,514</b>		
<u>Explanation:</u> These funds restore the \$12.5 million reduction to the FY 2000 appropriated amount for spares and repair parts. Funding supports both new and accumulated spares requirements due to aging weapon systems, high OPTEMPO, force structure changes, and constrained funding. Air Force mobility aircraft were critical to the success of the air war over Serbia and provide a vital link to forward-deployed forces. This will provide spare parts to improve/sustain MCR.								
<u>Budget Activity 3: Training and Recruiting</u>						<b>+6,197</b>		
<u>Explanation:</u> These funds restore the \$6.2 million reduction to the FY 2000 appropriated amount for spares and repair parts. Funding supports both new and accumulated spares requirements due to aging weapon systems, high OPTEMPO, force structure changes, and constrained funding. This will provide spare parts needed to improve/sustain MCR.

Explanation: These funds restore the \$2.6 million reduction to the FY 2000 appropriated amount for spares and repair parts. The remaining \$129.4 million supports both new and accumulated spares requirements due to aging weapon systems, high OPTEMPO, force structure changes, and constrained funding. The Air Force provided the necessary contract authority for the working capital fund to place orders for additional aircraft repair parts in FY 1999. These funds are needed to pay for these items upon delivery during FY 2000. The additional inventory levels are needed to improve stockage, issue effectiveness, and arrest decline in readiness and sustainability of AF aircraft by making spare parts available.
