<p><u>Explanation:</u> For FY 2000, the Congress provided an additional \$25.060 million for medical-related Research, Development, Test, and Evaluation (RDT&E) projects to the Operation and Maintenance (O&M) budget activity of the Defense Health Program (DHP) appropriation. Implementation of the rescission levied by section 301 of Public Law 106-113 reduced these programs to \$24.621 million. The DHP, O&M budget activity is, however, the wrong appropriation to execute this funding. This reprogramming action transfers these funds to the RDT&E budget activity, which is the correct appropriation for proper execution.</p>
