This transfer does not change the purpose for which the funds were originally appropriated. It meets all administrative and legal requirements of the Congress and the Congress has not denied any of the items.</p>

<u>Explanation:</u> Of the increase, \$1.6 million will be used to replace SPAWAR PMW-159 LINK 16 equipment that remains in theater. This equipment supports the air operations in the Balkans and potential ground operations and it provides needed capabilities identified by Operation Allied Force Lessons Learned. The remaining \$6.1 million will be administered by the Navy, as Executive Agent, and transferred to the Joint Forces Command for execution. Specifically, these funds will be used to replace Joint Forces Command equipment that remains in the theater supporting the air operations in the Balkans and any potential ground operations (\$0.1 million); to procure additional Operational Allied Force contingency suites of equipment (termed Joint Interoperability Control Officer tool kits)(\$2.0 million); and to procure unlimited use of data rights to the Rosetta technology (\$4.0 million).
