<p><u>Explanation:</u> The Marine Corps Communication/Electronic Infrastructure Support program is an aggregation of inter-related data processing disciplines. The overall objective is to achieve modernization and increase processing capacity. The FY 2000 Appropriations Act increased this program by \$45 million for the upgrade and/or replacement of key information infrastructure components, located within buildings at several Marine Corps bases. Within this amount, \$5 million is needed to support United States Commander in Chief Pacific Command (USCINCPAC) Headquarters Command, Control, Communications, Computers, and Intelligence (C4I) equipment upgrades at Camp Smith, Hawaii. Because the Department of the Navy is the executive agent for the unified Commander in Chief requirement, this support is more appropriately funded in the Other Procurement, Navy, 00/02, appropriation.</p>

Within this amount, \$10.687 million is needed to complete the base telecommunication infrastructure upgrade, internal voice and data cable wiring replacement, and radio trunking, to provide communications connectivity from mainside to training areas. This effort is more appropriately funded in Procurement, Marine Corps, 00/02.</p>
