<p>This action transfers \$7.714 million from the Operation and Maintenance, Defense-Wide (O&M, D-W), FY 2000, appropriation to the Research, Development, Test, and Evaluation, Defense-Wide (RDT&E, D-W), 00/01, appropriation to correctly align the Commercial Technology and Maintenance Activities (CTMA) congressional add for execution. The transfer does not change the purpose for which the funds were originally appropriated. This action uses general transfer authority, pursuant to section 8005 of Public Law 106-79, the DoD Appropriations Act, 2000; and section 1001 of Public Law 106-65, the National Defense Authorization Act for FY 2000. It meets all administrative and legal requirements of the Congress and has not previously been denied by the Congress.</p>

<p><u>Explanation:</u> The CTMA program is a cooperative agreement between the National Center for Manufacturing Sciences (NCMS) and DUSD(Logistics) to co-sponsor technology development, deployment, and validation. The objective is to infuse commercial manufacturing technologies and best business practices into DoD maintenance activities. In previous years, funding for the CTMA program has been appropriated in the RDT&E, D-W appropriation and executed by the Defense Logistics Agency (DLA). In FY 2000, the Congress added the funding to the Office of the Secretary of Defense (OSD) O&M, D-W appropriation. This action transfers the funding from the OSD O&M, D-W appropriation to the DLA RDT&E, D-W appropriation for execution.</p>
