This internal reprogramming action transfers \$5.180 million from Other Procurement, Army, 00/02, to Operation and Maintenance, Army, FY 2000, for proper execution. The transfer does not change the purpose for which the funds were originally appropriated. This action requires the use of general transfer authority, pursuant to section 8005 of Public Law 106-79, the DoD Appropriations Act, 2000, and section 1001 of Public Law 106-65, the National Defense Authorization Act for FY 2000. This action meets all administrative and legal requirements of the Congress and has not previously been denied by the Congress.

Explanation: The FY 2000 DoD Appropriations Act provided \$15.0 million of procurement funds to assess biometrics systems. In January 2000, \$5.0 million was reprogrammed to Operation and Maintenance, Army (O&MA) to fund initial critical studies and assessments of biometrics requirements. An additional \$5.180 million must now be reprogrammed to O&MA to appropriately execute the intent of the congressional add. These funds will procure leases for office space, provide for support staff (and associated travel), continue studies, establish academic partnerships, provide for assistance teams and fund a biometrics demonstration pilot.
