This internal reprogramming action realigns funds between line items within Procurement, Defense-Wide, 01/03, and between program elements within Research, Development, Test, and Evaluation, Defense-Wide, 01/02, for proper execution of congressionally added funds for Low-Profile Night Vision Goggles and Small Combatant Craft and Littoral Warfare Craft. This action does not change the purpose for which the funds were originally appropriated. It meets all administrative and legal requirements of the Congress and has not previously been denied by the Congress. This action also involves three congressional special interest items.

Explanation: The Congress added \$4.0 million in FY 2001 for night vision goggles in the Miscellaneous Equipment line item. All night vision programs have been executed in the Small Arms and Weapons line. This action therefore realigns the funds to the proper line item.
