



This internal reprogramming action transfers funds from Operation and Maintenance (O&M), Air Force, FY 2001, to Procurement, Defense-Wide, 01/03, to properly execute congressionally added funds for MH-53J/M Simulator Upgrades. This action uses general transfer authority, pursuant to section 8005 of Public Law 106-259, the DoD Appropriations Act, 2001; and section 1001 of Public Law 106-398, the Floyd D. Spence National Defense Authorization Act for FY 2001. This action does not change the purpose for which the funds were originally appropriated. It meets all administrative and legal requirements of the Congress and has not previously been denied by the Congress. This action involves a congressional special interest item.

Explanation: The Congress added \$8.0 million in Air Force O&M for the Theater Air Command and Control Simulation Facility (TACCSF) at Kirtland Air Force Base, New Mexico. These funds were intended for upgrades to the MH-53J/M Simulator to reflect the Interactive Defensive Avionics System/Multi-Mission Advanced Tactical Terminal (IDAS/MATT) modernization program configuration. Because this type modification is normally financed with procurement funds and because the MH-53J/M is a Special Operations Command asset, these funds are more appropriately executed in the Special Operations Command procurement line for SOF Training Systems. The amount transferred reflects an \$18,000 rescission pursuant to Public Law 106-554, the Consolidated Appropriations Act.
