This action transfers \$6.0 million from the Operation and Maintenance, Defense-Wide (O&M, DW), FY 2002, appropriation to the Research, Development, Test, and Evaluation, Defense-Wide (RDT&E, DW), 02/03, appropriation for proper execution of the Commercial Technology and Maintenance Activities (CTMA) program. The transfer does not change the purpose for which the funds were originally appropriated. This action uses general transfer authority, pursuant to section 8005 of Public Law 107-117, the DoD Appropriations Act, 2002, and section 1001 of Public Law 107-107, the National Defense Authorization Act for FY 2002. It meets all administrative and legal requirements of the Congress and has not previously been denied by the Congress. This action affects a congressional special interest item.

Explanation: The CTMA program is a cooperative effort between the National Center for Manufacturing Sciences and DUSD(Logistics & Materiel Readiness) to co-sponsor technology development, deployment, and validation. The objective is to infuse commercial manufacturing technologies and best business practices into DoD maintenance activities. In previous years, funding for the CTMA program has been appropriated in RDT&E, DW appropriation and executed by the Defense Logistics Agency. In FY 2002, the Congress added the funding to the O&M, DW appropriation. This reprogramming action is necessary to execute the program in the proper appropriation and does not change the purpose for which the funds were appropriated.
