Explanation: In FY 2002, Congress appropriated \$1.0 million in the Research, Development, Test, and Evaluation (RDT&E), Air Force appropriation for Commodity Management System Consolidation (CMSC). The CMSC is a transition effort at DLA to consolidate and integrate commodity management systems used by DLA. The objective is to manage program risks, applying a strategy designed to include a series of manageable successes, which combine incremental development, testing, and fielding of manageable subsets of the databases of legacy systems. Prior to FY 2002, funding for this effort was appropriated in the RDT&E, Defense-Wide appropriation and executed by the DLA. In FY 2001, the Congress added \$3.0 million to the RDT&E, DW appropriation for this effort. This year, the Congress added funds for CMSC, but this time the funds were added to the RDT&E, Air Force appropriation. There is \$0.957 million available for transfer to DLA subsequent to the Air Force applying congressionally imposed undistributed reductions.

Also in FY 2002, the Congress added \$5.0 million to OSD's RDT&E, Defense-Wide appropriation for miniaturized wireless systems. The Congress directed that the funds be used only to initiate a university-industry program to utilize advances in the three-dimensional chip scale packaging and high temperature superconducting transceiver performance, to reduce the size, weight, power consumption and cost of advanced wireless communication systems. The funds were added to an OSD's C3I Intelligence program instead of Defense Micro-Electronics Activity (DMEA) under DLA. This reprogramming action transfers these funds to DLA for proper execution.

This reprogramming action does not alter the congressional intent for use of the funds.
