This internal reprogramming action transfers \$.7 million to the Defense Health Program from the Operation and Maintenance, Navy, FY 2002, appropriation for proper execution. This action uses general transfer authority pursuant to section 8005 of Public Law 107-117, the DoD Appropriations Act, 2002, and section 1001 of Public Law 107-107, the National Defense Authorization Act for FY 2002. Reclassification is required to properly execute funds in accordance with congressional intent. This realignment does not change the purpose for which the funds were originally appropriated, meets all administrative and legal requirements of the Congress, and has not previously been denied by the Congress.

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This item is a congressional special interest item. In FY 2002, Congress added \$4.3 million to the Operation and Maintenance, Navy appropriation for Center of Excellence (COE) for Disaster Management and Humanitarian Assistance. Funding of \$.7 million was to go toward initiatives involving the Casualty Care Research Center. The Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences (USUHS) manages the casualty care research and education missions of the Center for Disaster and Humanitarian Assistance Medicine (CDHAM). The CDHAM meets the demand for military medical humanitarian assistance across the Military Health System (MHS) through the development of curricula and specific training courses in disaster administration, field medical care, operational logistics, and health assessment and surveillance. Training is provided in support of both medical students at the University and residency training programs throughout the MHS to ensure DoD first responders have the requisite knowledge to effectively deal with disaster management. Additionally, CDHAM provides consultative support and collaboration to the DoD leadership and Commanders in Chief, serves as a research base in the fields of disaster preparedness, assessment, surveillance, medical care, and recovery, and assists in developing institutional policy for disaster response and humanitarian aid. As the academic focus point for military medicine, the USUHS is funded in the Defense Health Program. Therefore, a reclassification reprogramming is necessary for proper execution.
